Heber Robert "Bobby" Burke II, age 59 of Shelbyville, passed away April 19, 2018. A Celebration of Life service will be held at Feldhaus Memorial Chapel from 3:00 to 5:00 PM on April 29th. His ashes will be scattered at his favorite fishing hole prior to the service.

Bobby was born in Prestonsburg, Kentucky on November 4, 1958. The family moved to Shelbyville Tennessee when Bobby was 1 ½ years old. After graduating from Shelbyville Central High School, he joined the U.S. Marines Reserves, where he served for 12 years. In 1990, he married Kimberly Pace Dossett of Gilbertsville Kentucky, who suffered an aneurysm after only 4 years of marriage. Bobby cared for Kim's needs throughout their marriage until ALS would no longer allow him to.

Bobby was an over-the-road truck driver for major truck lines for over 30 years and for several years, he hosted a neighborhood garden on his property. His greatest pleasures were family, fishing, gardening, caring for and playing with his Pugs (Manny and Sophie), and watching movies.
