Linda was a respected paramedic who worked the now PRTN dispatch center. The ER staff knew that when Linda was on duty they could count on her professionalism and knowledge to handle any situation. The expertise, experience, and certification in her field allowed her to train many others in how to be an excellent dispatcher. The knowledge I learned about being a dispatcher, prioritizing, organizing, and how to use my resources all came from Linda. My job as a transport nurse is inherently dangerous. I always took comfort in the fact that if anything happened, I knew she would manage it.
