entry-level position and ascended to upper management before her retirement. She was

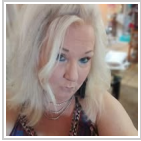
particularly proud of her leadership and participation in the National Association of Women in Construction, which reflected her commitment to empowering women in her field.
