Mr. Wilson Rogers, Jr., age 76, of Shelbyville, passed away Sunday, September 22, 2019.

Graveside services will be 5 PM Thursday, September 26, 2019, at Gatlin Cemetery in Ardmore, Alabama.

The family will receive visitors 12 noon until 3 o'clock Thursday at Feldhaus Memorial Chapel.

He was born May 15, 1943, in Athens, Alabama, to the late Wilson and Minnie Mae Culps Rogers, Sr. He was a retired sales manager from Patterson Dental Supply.
